## Millennium of the Abbey San Michele Arcangelo de Procida

We know little about the history of Procida in the Middle Ages, sources are very rare. Thus, the parchment found in the archives of Naples is very valuable because it attests that the mother church was already in 1026 the monastery of Sant' Angelo.

The incipit of the transaction recalls the time of Constantine VIII, Emperor of the Roman Empire from Constantinople - Byzantium, now Istanbul.

At that time, Procida was part of the Duchy of Naples, a Byzantine province that has always had a very close relationship with the East. The Duchy of Naples, like Amalfi and Gaeta, had a great maritime force in the Middle Ages since the hinterland was dominated by the Lombards and then by the Normans. Procida was part of this force, maintaining very close relations with the city, which at the time had about 30,000 inhabitants.

**This year, Procida celebrates the 1000<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the proven existence of its Christian foundations and the Archangel protector of the island.**
