Scotto dí Gregorio Family Reunion: Procida, Italy

Follow-up story to SBCGS's Torrance Centennial Program, Who Do You Think You Are? (Other articles were in the 2012 Nov/Dec and 2013 Jan/Feb issues)

During the preliminary meetings with the featured families of our 2012 program, *Torrance: Who Do You Think You Are?* Mayor Frank Scotto shared with us what little he knew about his father, Tommaso before he came to the US. Fortunately he had a copy of Tommaso's Social Security application that provided information to start research in Italy.

With the help of Pascal Scotto di Vettimo, President of the association, *La Grande Famille de Procida & Ischia*, the Scotto di Gregorio lineage on the island of Procida was traced back to the 16th century. As a bonus, instigated by Pascal, Mayor Scotto was presented with a letter from the Mayor of Procida, extending his friendship and hopes that the Torrance Mayor would be able to visit Procida, perhaps in May 2013 to attend the General Meeting of *La Grande Famille*.

The Mayor also had photos from trips his father had taken back to Procida, alone, in the 1960's & 70's. They were wonderful family photos . . . with no names written on the backs! We sent a few of the photos to Pascal asking if there was

any way to identify the people in the photos. In about 2 weeks, we got an answer. Pascal asked his in-laws for help and they identified the older woman as Tommaso's sister, Giovannina and 2 of her sons, a daughter and daughter-in-law. One of the sons, Nicola, is the father of Pascal's wife's best friend!!

Note: because Nicola did not have the Scotto surname, Pascal did NOT know that he personally had a connection to the family when he starting researching for us!!

And so . . . on May 3rd, 2013 Frank Scotto, with his brother, Michael and their wives, arrived at the port of

Procida, greeted by their 1st cousin, Nicola, and a 2nd cousin (it was eventually determined that his grandfather and Frank's grandfather were brothers).

On Sunday, Mayor Scotto and I attended the Association's meeting, where Pascal presented him with further research

proving that his 6th great-grandfather, Michael Scotto di Gregorio, was Mayor of Procida in 1693. In the afternoon, Nicola took the Scotto brothers and wives to see the houses where their father had lived and visit a few more relatives. It was an incredible experience for the Mayor and his brother to meet their cousins and there were some tearful goodbyes at the end of the weekend.
